As our annual volume under management continues to grow, Tsain-Ko Forestry Limited Partnership is seeking a motivated, safety-focused, and field-oriented Field Planner to support our active coastal forestry operations.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Reporting to the Area Engineer, the Field Planner will support and lead the development of road and harvest plans while maintaining high standards for safety, environmental stewardship, quality, productivity, and cost control. This position involves a balance of field and office work and requires regular travel throughout Tsain-Ko's operating areas on the Sunshine Coast.

THE DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conducting cut block and road layout in the field on a regular basis.
- Designing and developing cut blocks, coordinating surveying and mapping activities and managing results and timelines.
- Developing and preparing road and harvest plans and permits.
- Monitoring the quality of cut block layouts and files.
- Supporting silviculture foresters on an as needed basis.
- Supporting Foresters and Engineers on operational planning and supervision.
- Supporting the safe execution of planned harvest activities.
- Traveling to and working across Tsain-ko's land base and, on occasion, at remote camps.

QUALIFICATIONS, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- Diploma or degree in Forestry, Forest Engineering, or a natural resource-related field.
- Forestry field experience or operational forestry experience is preferred.
- Two or more years of forestry engineering experience is preferred, but not required.
- RFT, FIT, RPF, EIT, or eligibility for professional registration with the FPBC or EGBC is considered an asset.
- Working knowledge of coastal harvesting systems and road construction practices is considered an asset.
- Experience with, or willingness to learn, ArcGIS, ROADENG, LiDAR, GPS systems, and Microsoft Office Suite.
- Strong communication, leadership, and organizational skills.
- Ability to work outdoors in all weather and terrain conditions.
- Ability to build respectful working relationships with employees, supervisors, contractors, and external stakeholders.
- Valid Class 5 Driver's Licence and reliable transportation are required.
- Small Vessel Operator Proficiency (SVOP) and boat experience are considered assets.
